


The adults (including this fireman) enjoyed the events as much as the students did!

This year's program concerned three topics of critical global importance: the intellectual property and distribution of medicines, unemployment and workforce development, and food insecurity. #### SPECIAL EDUCATION CORNER



The students in Mr. Hudnut's Autistic Support Vocational Skills class have been very busy this spring. We started out by making Leprechauns and Celtic Knots to hang in the windows. Boy, the light shining through our creations left some nice shadows! Then we learned how to do Rorschach mirror images and created a nice landscape using 3 shapes, a circle, a triangle and a rectangle. When folded over and then opened back up, an image that looked like a sunset over a lake in the forest was revealed. Finally, we got down to some tool work again. The students love working with tools. We have been learning how to use different sockets and wrenches to take apart and rebuild wooden planks. The students take apart all of the nuts, bolts, and washers, then clean up the wood before rebuilding the structure. We even began having to see who can turn a wrench with speed and precision. Some great partnerships developed and even a few solo carpenters emerged!


