Happy New Year to all our kindergarten families! We hope that 2021 brings health and happiness to you! The kindergarteners continue to do an amazing job navigating learning in a virtual setting. They start each day with happy faces, eager to learn and have fun. In Reading/ELA, students have been reading and discussing stories that help answer the question: How can I be the healthiest me? The students are learning about topic, central idea, and details. Phonemic awareness, letter sounds, and letter formation continue to be important as the children develop early reading skills. Ask your kindergartener to show you how to tap out three letter cvc words. In Math, we practiced adding to 10 and now we are beginning to subtract. It's really exciting to see how much the students are learning and we are looking forward to more growth in the weeks and months ahead!


