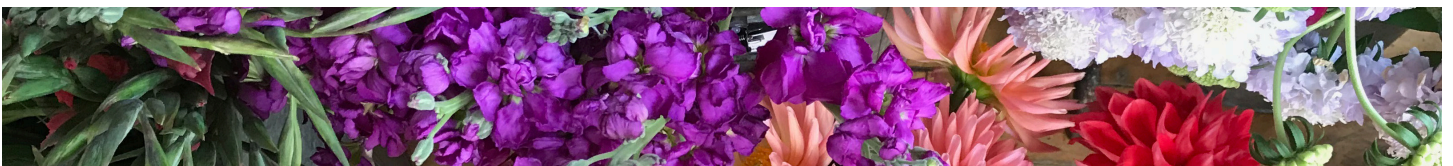
Principal's Message

Students in grades 3 through 5 are learning how the Library is organized. They are also learning about the parts of a nonfiction books and how these parts apply to databases and websites.

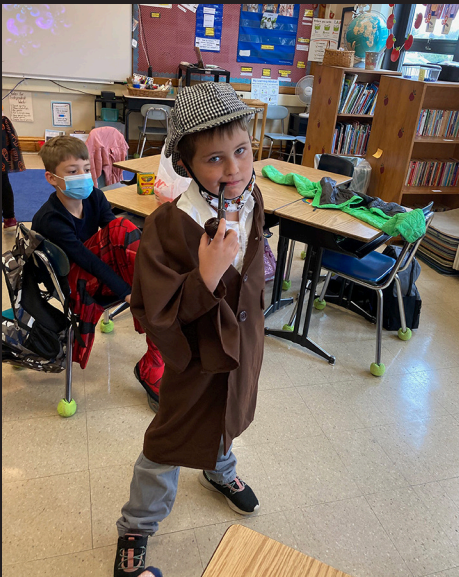
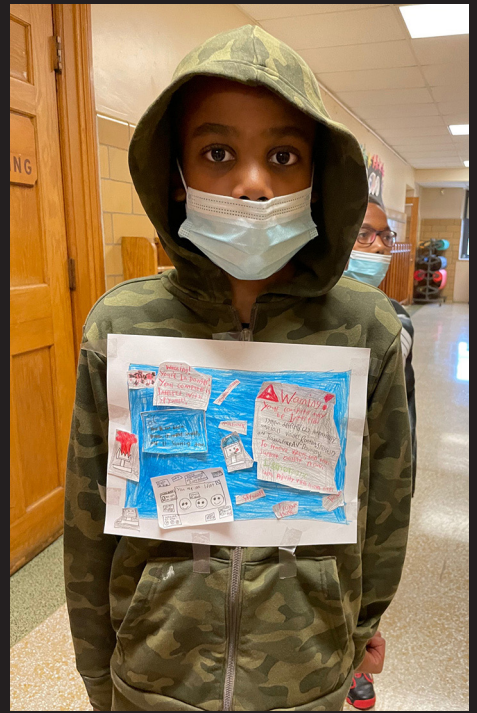

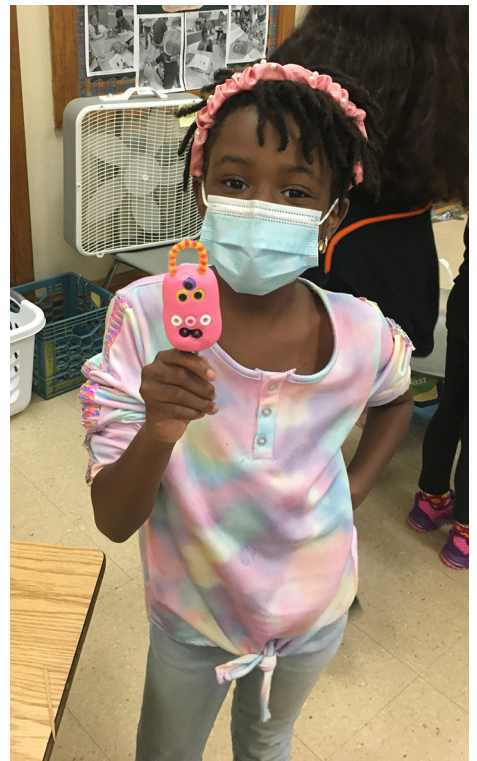

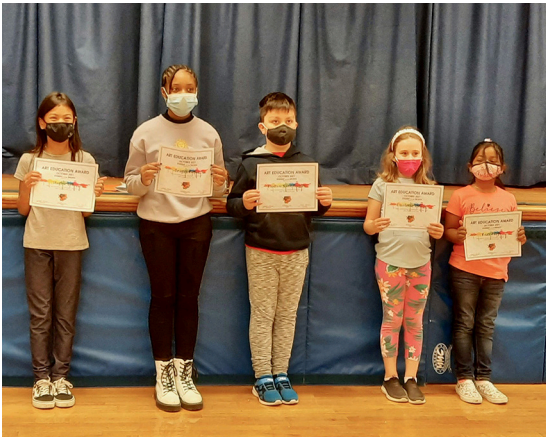
