Positive Behavior Support System **Flowchart** 

All students will receive Tier Lintervention through the following Students will begin each marking period with a satisfactory grade on the behavior reporting section of the Progress Report.

When a student violates the UDSD Elementary Code of Conduct, a Behavior Infraction Referral (BIR) will be written. Parent contact will be made each time a BIR is submitted. The following Tier I interventions will be implemented:

- 1. Aronimink Standards of Behavior
- 2. Teacher / Student Conference
- 3. Stop and Think



If a student does not generate any BIRs and exemplifies behavior expectations within a marking period, that student may receive a **Very Good** grade on the behavior reporting section of the Elementary Progress Report.



If a student accumulates up to 4 Tier 1 / Tier 2 BIRs within a marking period, that student will receive a **Satisfactory** grade. When a student receives the fourth BIR he/she will be given an individualized Tier II intervention.

Faculty Mentor (3 Weeks)

- Behavior Chart with Checkin/Check-out Teacher –
- 2. Faculty Mentor
- 3. After school detention
- 4. Parent Student Principal problem solving conference
- 5. Social Worker referral
- 6. Reteach lessons with reflection
- 7. Conflict Resolution
- 8. Mediation

The Core Behavioral Team will monitor students' progression through Tier II interventions to determine rate of progress or need to move to a more intensive level of intervention.

Students who accumulate five or more Tier I and/ or Tier II referrals during a marking period will receive a **Needs Improvement** grade on the behavior reporting section of the Elementary Progress Report. Students who continue to generate multiple BIRs, will be given a more intensive Tier II intervention or transition to a Tier III intervention.



The following **TIER III** interventions may be provided:

- 1. Social work referral for social skills group, individual social work sessions
- 2. ESAP or other community resource referral
- 3. SST Behavior Team referral
- 4. Multi Disciplinary Evaluation
