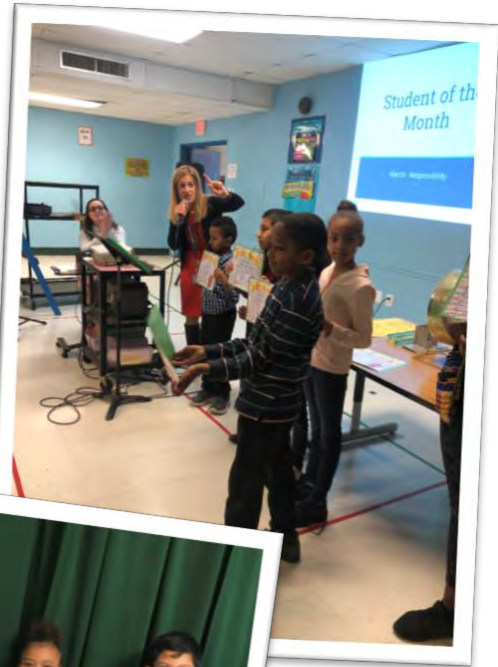


## Principal Award Winner Emmanuela Lacle
