GARRETTFORD STAFF USE MANY TOOLS TO PROMOTE POSITIVE STUDENT BEHAVIOR

The Upper Darby Elementary School Code of Character embodies the basic principles of responsibility, respect, and safe student behavior. We provide a restorative approach to student concerning behaviors, and the importance of stakeholder relationships are integral to this approach.

The PBIS (Positive Behavior Intervention and Support) and restorative approach are at the foundation of our program. We promote positive behavior through Student of the Month Awards, the Bucket Bucks Store and the We Are All Here Program.

This month's Student of the Month Awards featured the trait "Responsibility." Children who exhibit accountability, pursuit of excellence and exercises self-control were identified. These students were honored in a school-wide video, awarded a certificate and ribbon.







The "We Are All Here Program" is an initiative created by our Social Worker, Mrs. Monachello, to promote regular attendance and arriving on time


for school. Each day that the entire class is present and arrives on time, the teacher affixes a stamp on the monthly chart. At the end of the month, the charts are turned in to Mrs. Monachello. The opening of the Bucket Bucks Store was an exciting event for our students. The store features prizes and activities, such as extra art class, which the students can purchase with their "Bucket Bucks." Students earn the bucks as rewards for positive behavior.
