1st Grade News


FIRST GRADE LOVES SCIENCE!

2nd Grade News





Students learned about chemical reactions when certain solids and liquids are combined. Using a few ingredients, students mixed Borax, glue and water to make slime. Fifth Grade students at Hillcrest Elementary School have been learning about the election process by electing and forming a Student Council.
