## Wee Deliver is Back for the 2019-2020 School Year!



## Busy in Kindergarten

Kindergarten has been busy learning the expectations of school and also learning lots of new things! We had Color Week and went to the library for the first time to check out a book! We have been learning about numbers from 1-5 and also about the meaning of greater than and less than. We have been reading lots of new books and writing about those stories. We are looking forward to lots more fun and learning.



## Place Value Fun

Second grade has been busy this past month learning about place value. We learned all about hundreds, tens, and ones. Some things we learned specifically were how to draw the different representations of number values, write number words, use expanded form, and find patterns in numbers. We also turned our learning into some fun for the season!



## 3<sup>rd</sup> Graders - Hard at Work

September was filled with many new adventures for our third graders. They practiced and learned their new routines "BOO"-tifully. You should be very proud of your child's efforts.

In science, three classes learned about the power of SOUND, while the other two experienced the beauty of PLANT GROWTH and DEVELOPMENT.

Our new intoReading program had the children reading and writing like never before! To date, the students have written a personal narrative and a formal letter. Ask your child to whom they wrote their letter...we can't wait to meet that person in the future!

Math this month focused on reviewing addition and subtraction. Continue to work on regrouping with your child at home. Mastering math facts for addition and subtraction is vital for continued success in the program. Try to practice your child's facts for about 10 minutes each night.

In October, we will be beginning a new science topic (classes that learned Sound will now do Plants and vice versa). In math, we will complete Chapter 2 on ORGANIZING DATA into graphs or tables and then begin Chapter 3 on MULTIPLICATION. Finally, our reading focus will shift into Module 3: Let Freedom Ring. October will be a month of many new opportunities. It looks to be another "SPOOK-TACULAR month for sure!





## 4<sup>th</sup> Grade Visits Riverbend

Fourth grade students at Hillcrest attended a trip to Riverbend in Gladwyne. They participated in hands-on, inquiry-based programs that included experiences with nature. Students learned about different types of animal habitats, watershed environments and mostly, about how to be Earth friendly!

Overall, the children had a great day learning in an outdoor school and enjoyed getting their hands (and feet) wet!

A huge thank you to the science department for scheduling and funding this trip to Riverbend. It was a great experience!



## Around the World at the Philadelphia Art Museum



5th graders will visit the Philadelphia Art Museum on October 29th and 30th for their first scheduled tour titled, "Around the World". They will visit various rooms of the museum learning about different cultures, comparing works of art, and finding common threads to art that they created in school. During their visit, the art museum docent talks about each art piece as students create an Around the World travelogue. This interactive trip will be the first visit of two this year. The next visit will take place in February of 2020. Thanks to the Philadelphia Art Museum grant, they sponsor this visit for 5th grade students in the Upper Darby School District yearly.
