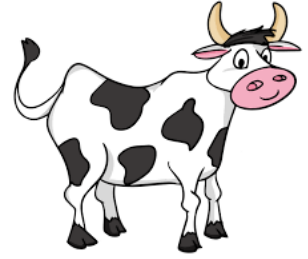

Miss Waldron- I love scary movies and haunted houses! I try to go every year. Getting scared makes me laugh!

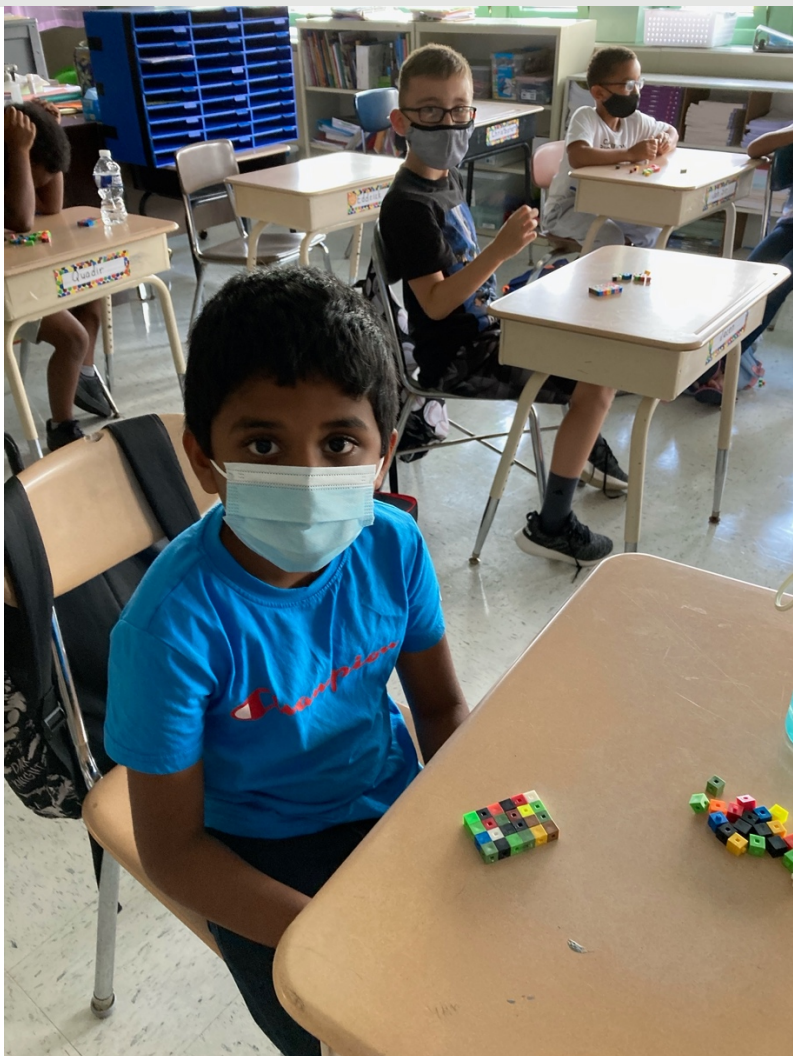
Mrs. Ellis - I LOVE haunted houses and all things spooky! The scarier the better! BOO!

Ms. Lardani, our school librarian, is hosting our first ever online pumpkin

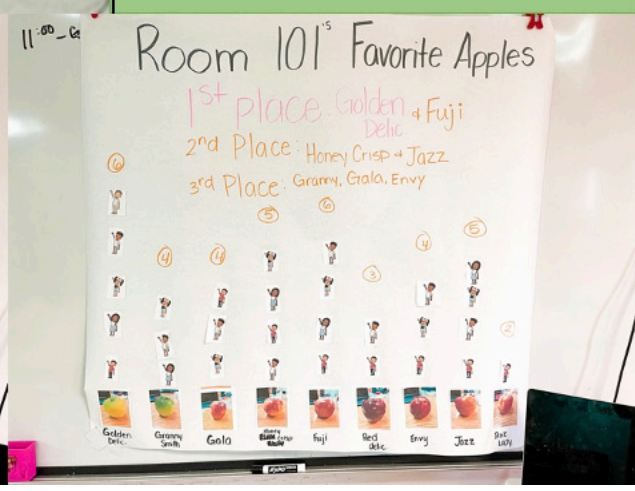
