Senkow's Student Council 2022-23

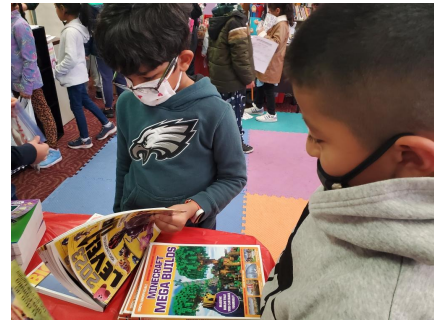

November Elections

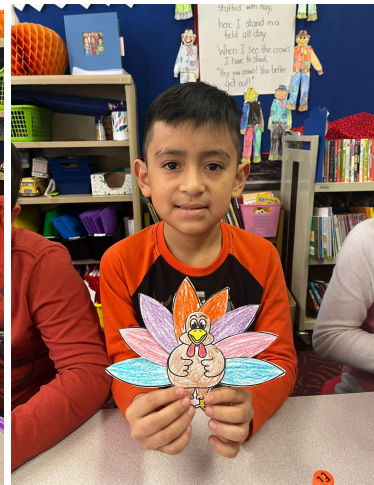
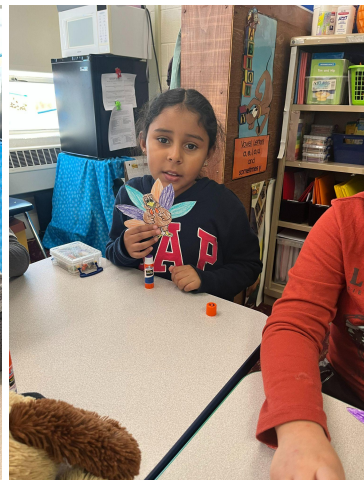
