

In Miss Tabassum's third grade class, they are learning about sound in Science. Students used paper cups and string to create their own telephones. Then, they worked with a partner and stood across the room from each other. One person was the "voice" and the other person was the "ears". The voice whispered a number and the ear had to hold up the number of fingers to match the number they heard. Through this activity, we found that sound can travel far by sending vibrations through the string.
