UDHS AND BOEING COLLABORATE ON "FACTORY OF THE FUTURE"

This year, Mr. Chris Phillips and Upper Darby High School students Daanish Rehman, Nihon Tirtho, Muntassir Nabeel, Manveer Singh, Josiah Saddick, Michael DL Nguyen, Bon Phosouvanh Sythong, Khatib Ashraf, Jayden Finger, Jianni Williams, Sabir Starks, and David Faust, partnered with Boeing Helicopter in Ridley for a special program that investigated many aspects of the manufacturing and aerospace industry. Boeing hosted the students from the Engineering II class for six workshops at Boeing Helicopter in Ridley. These workshops consisted of many tours of the Chinook and V-22 rotorcraft production lines, the composite manufacturing center, wind tunnel, and other areas of the facility, as well as workshops in assembly methods, modeling, and simulation.

For the last 26 years, students enrolled in the engineering program have had the opportunity to participate in this program, requiring them to develop their own product line and manufacturing facility. These students will present their Factory of the Future projects to parents, school administrators, and Boeing officials on the 18th of April at the Boeing Rotorcraft facility.

Class Advances in PennDOT Innovations Challenge

Mr. Trung Tchiong's class was a finalist in the Region 6 PennDOT Innovations Challenge, a statewide competition that challenges high school students to come up with solutions to real-world transportation challenges. Mr. Tchiong's class answered the challenge with the following:

Develop an innovative approach to increase commercial truck parking that can accommodate up to 30 semi trucks that are generally 48ft-53 ft long. It will also have restroom facilities, gas services, an on-site medical center, water drainage, and conventional energy security systems to protect all types of drivers–a green energy gadget to promote the echo system and reduce waste.

The students presented their idea on March 8 in King of Prussia, and competed against Conestoga High School (Chester County), Lower Moreland High School (Montgomery County), and two teams from Pennridge High School (Buck County). While Conestoga was the ultimate winner, our students from Upper Darby were the only representatives from Delaware County, and are to be congratulated!




Royal Math Team Winning Season
