DROP OFF AND PICK-UP REMINDERS

While we love your child, are committed to his/her safety and are flexible when unforeseen occurrences happen, we do not have budgeted staff supervising children prior to school start up or for late pick-ups during after schools hours.

- Please walk your child into the office when dropping him/her off late to school.
- Please **DO NOT DOUBLE PARK** and block the street during student drop-offs and pick-ups.

Your compliance with these reminders will ensure the safety of our children.

STUDENTS TRAVELING TO AND FROM SCHOOL – Please speak with your child about coming <u>straight to school in the mornings</u> and going <u>straight home after</u> <u>dismissal.</u> This includes their stopping at local stores and other students' homes. Travel to and from school becomes a greater safety concern when students alter from their regular routes and schedules.

Please DO NOT drop off students to school prior to 8:40 a.m. No staff is available to supervise children before then.

- A *limited* number of staff have been budgeted for extra duty and assigned to supervise student activity from 8:40 to 8:55 a.m. Please DO NOT expect any school employee to be available to supervise student activity prior to this time. We are asking that you NOT send your child to the schoolyard prior to 8:40 a.m.
- This includes daycare students. Daycare providers have been informed that there is no Stonehurst Hills staff available to supervise daycare students who are dropped off by their facilities prior to 8:40 a.m. We have sent our welcome package to each daycare supervising Stonehurst Hills students detailing our arrival and dismissal guidelines.

After the 1st week of school, we are asking that parents drop students off at the front door (grades 1 and 2) and on the playground (grades 3, 4 and 5). This helps teachers begin to help students to enter the building in an orderly way and ensures that instruction begins on time. We thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Parents dropping students off after 9:15 a.m. will need to walk the child <u>INTO THE</u> <u>OFFICE</u>. Please do not just drop a students off to walk into by her/himself after 9:15 a.m. the school without a parent/guardian.

Please DO NOT ENTER OR BLOCK the back parking lot with vehicles at any time. Your compliance with this reminder will ensure the safety of our children. The Upper Darby Police Department will be contacted for any safety issues.

Please DO NOT DOUBLE PARK and block the street during student drop-offs and pickups. **Please be considerate of our neighbors and your fellow parents.** Your compliance with this reminder will ensure the safety of our children. ATTENDANCE



<u>Please refer to the school district's policy # 204 for more information. Review an</u> <u>excerpt from the policy below:</u>

The Board considers the following conditions to constitute reasonable cause for absence from school or an excused absence:

- 1. Illness.
- 2. Quarantine.
- 3. Family emergency.
- 4. Recovery from accident.
- 5. Death in family.
- 6. Family educational travel, upon written request from parents/guardians with prior written approval from the building principal. No educational travel will be approved for students required to take PSSA, Keystone or other state mandated testing, during mandatory testing periods.
- 7. Educational tours and trips, upon written request from parents/guardians with prior written approval from the building principal. No educational tours/trips will be approved for students required to take PSSA, Keystone or other state mandated testing, during mandatory testing periods.

Parent Involvement

Volunteering

Parent volunteers are a huge resource for our school community. When students see parents volunteer in their school and classrooms and on field trips, they recognize the importance of education in families and see in action how the community takes an interest in their learning. We welcome parent volunteers!

Upper Darby School District Volunteers are required to submit the PA Criminal Background Check, the FBI Criminal Clearance and the PA Child Abuse History Clearance along with their school district Volunteer Application. All required forms can be found on the Forms and Clearance district webpage.

Stonehurst Hills ES Home and School Association

All parents are expected to be members. Membership costs \$5.00 per family.

The Stonehurst Hills Elementary School Home and School Association meets on the second Tuesday of each month at 5:30 p.m. During these meetings, the members speak with other parents about fundraising to support student activities. Principal Beauford also presents a monthly report on school matters.

Committee Work

Parents are sought after for their input in school decision-making. Occasionally, Principal Beauford will organize subcommittees to work on short-term special projects. Such projects include our Comprehensive School Improvement Planning Team, the Upper Darby School District Home and School Association, the annual Stonehurst Hills Color Day Planning Team, community outreach and other building-specific committee work.

Positive Behavior Interventions and Support



At Stonehurst Hills, our *award-winning* work around Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) involves reinforcing the 3 Bs every day and in everything we do: *Be Safe, Responsible and Be Respectful.* We work tirelessly to keep our school a safe and orderly place for all students. We are very proud of the success we are experiencing in implementing Positive Behavior Support (PBIS) in our school.

Our goal is to provide support to students in every setting in the school building, on school grounds and while traveling to and from school. To that end, we strive to implement this comprehensive approach to building positive school culture with the goal of teaching students skills that will support their efforts to be safe, responsible and respectful throughout the school day.

Having a coherent, school-wide plan is essential and has several benefits:

- 1. It fosters a positive school climate.
- 2. It focuses staff & student attention on appropriate behaviors and success and on students who are trying their best to meet our expectations rather than on any undesired behaviors. In this way, the school staff establishes what is important in our school as opposed to allowing students who are struggling implementing our expectations to do so.
- 3. It increases the chance that desired behaviors are repeated.
- 4. It reduces the time spent correcting misbehaviors and redirecting students. Any teacher can tell you about the academic cost of disciplining students, as significant loss of instructional time impacts student achievement tremendously.

How are students encouraged to exhibit the 3 Bs?

Standout Stallions

Students who demonstrate the 3Bs are praised verbally and may also receive Standout Stallions from their teacher or any staff member. Students are invited to "purchase" items from our **PBIS store** during their monthly class visit. They can also "purchase" vouchers, like extra recess, a homework pass, lunch with a staff member, etc.

Principal's 200 Club Golden Ticket

Students that demonstrate the 3Bs by doing something extraordinary, like showing citizenship, kindness, school spirit or any other amazing quality in a special way, receive the Principal's 200 Club golden ticket. A school administrator calls the home of the student with the good news about the students 3Bs behavior. These students are also given the chance to participate in a special surprise activity at the end of the school year. The more golden tickets they earn, the higher are their chances of participating in the surprise.

End-of-the-Month Incentive/Fun Friday

Each grade level has a weekly incentive program to promote students' demonstrating the 3 Bs. Students are required to meet their grade level's criteria for points earned by the end of the week. Students who meet the criteria participate in a Fun Friday activity. Students who do not meet the participation requirement for the Fun Friday activity participate in a PBIS lesson facilitated by one of their grade level teachers targeted to assist them in demonstrating the 3Bs more effectively.

Additionally, each Specials teacher requires PBIS to be followed in their classes as well. All students are expected to follow the **Specials Classes 5 Rules** in Music, Art, P.E. and Library.

The rules are:

- 1. Walk in quietly and sit down.
- 2. Raise your hand when you have something to say.
- 3. Hands and feet to yourself without permission. (Not just people, supplies and instruments as well.)
- 4. Follow directions the first time. (Art class This includes cleaning up materials at the first prompt.)
- 5. Be an active listener.

Each class has an opportunity to earn one sticker after every Specials class for demonstrating the 5 Rules. Three of the 5 rules must have been followed by the entire class in order to earn the sticker for that Special. All classes that earn at least 3 stickers for the month can participate in an incentive activity for that Specials class. Example: *If room 10 earns 3 or more stickers in Art class for the month of January they earn a "free choice" art class. This would be a regular scheduled art class where the students have an opportunity to work on an art activity of their choosing (free paint, airdry clay, pipecleaners, etc.)*

Student of the Month Assembly

Each month our entire school family gathers for our Student of the Month assembly to celebrate students' efforts in demonstrating the 3 Bs: *Be Safe. Be Respectful. Be Responsible.*

• Pillars of Character Certificates

Each month, a Pillar of Character is selected for all students to focus on demonstrating throughout the month schoolwide. Students participate in lessons targeting the selected Pillar of Character. The pillars are **TRUSTWORTHINESS, RESPECT, RESPONSIBILITY, FAIRNESS, CARING and CITIZENSHIP**.

- Two (2) students are selected **per homeroom class** for demonstrating the selected monthly Pillar of Character.
- Two (2) students are selected per Specials class for demonstrating the selected monthly Pillar of Character and outstanding effort.
 - Library Class Achievement
 - Music Class Achievement
 - Art Class Achievement
 - Physical Education Class Achievement
- Silver Awards
 - Silver Spoon Cafeteria 3 Bs/ Most Well-Behaved Class During Lunch: The class in each grade level with the best behavior exhibited during lunch is selected by the Building Assistants to receive the Silver Spoon award to be placed on their classroom door.
 - Silver Basketball Recess 3 Bs/ Most Well-Behaved Class During Recess: The class in each grade level with the best behavior exhibited during recess is selected by the Noontime Assistants to receive the Silver Basketball award to be placed on their classroom door.
 - Silver Sneaker Hallway 3 Bs/ Most Well-Behaved During Transitions: The class in each grade level with the best behavior exhibited during recess is selected by the Noontime Assistants to receive the <u>SILVER SNEAKERS AWARD</u> to be placed on their classroom door.
 - Silver Specials Coat of Arms The class in each grade level with the best behavior exhibited during Specials classes is selected by the Specialists Teacher Team to receive the SILVER SPECIALS COAT OF ARMS. The total points earned on the 5 Specials Classes Rules chart are tallied up per class. The class in each grade level with the highest

amount of points per grade is selected to receive this honor for the month. *One goal associated with this recognition is for students to realize that their behavior in each Specials class impacts their overall score.*

• Most Academic Improvement: BOY to MOY to EOY

Students have demonstrated academic improvement by:

- 1. moving up a performance level in the total reading scores or maintaining Advanced between Theme Tests (grades 1-5) OR
- 2. demonstrating Proficiency or Advanced on the Beginning of the Year (BOY) MAP test
- 3. demonstrating or maintaining Proficiency or Advanced on the Middle of the Year (MOY) MAP tests (grades 1-5) OR
- 4. demonstrating or maintaining Proficiency or Advanced on the End of the Year (EOY) MAP tests (grades 1-5)

• Perfect Attendance

Students who have achieved perfect attendance for <u>each quarter</u> are recognized. A certificate is presented to each student.

The class in each grade level with the highest student attendance rate for <u>each quarter</u> is recognized. The class receives a certificate to be placed on their classroom's door.

• Sumdog Top Class

The top class in each grade level for the month is recognized. The class receives a certificate to be placed on their classroom's door.

• Student Leadership

Students participating in student leadership roles (i.e. Student Council, Stallion Ambassadors, Participant in the Student Administration Day, etc.) are recognized with certificates **at the end of the school year**.

Academic and Social Enrichment and Extra-Curricular Student Activities

Stonehurst Hills Elementary School is proud to offer several opportunities that foster student learning in and out of the classroom. The following represents some of the ways we provide additional opportunities for students to pursue interests that contribute to their academic and social well-being.



School Dances, Activities and Events

Activities include *Soc Hop dances* for students in 1st, 2nd and 3rd grades, *Winter and Spring dances* for students in grades 4 and 5, *Wii Dance Parties*, *Family Bingo Nights* and much more.

Academic Enrichment and Support

Before- and after-school groups are held on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of each week from 3:15 to 4:00 p.m. Groups do <u>not</u> meet on Mondays and Fridays. The programs are <u>not</u> open

on school holidays, teacher professional development days, faculty meeting days or days when school closes early. The monthly school calendar lists the date(s) on which the groups do <u>not</u> meet.

If you would like for your child to participate in any of these activities, please see your child's teacher. Since groups are usually facilitated by only one staff member, the number of student participants is limited. Students invited to participate in any program must submit a permission slip signed by a parent. Students who fail to follow the Code of Student Conduct and to demonstrate the 3Bs will be excluded from the programs. We expect students to attend regularly, report on time and maintain conduct in line with the 3 B's: *Be safe. Be respectful. Be safe.*

Activity	Description
AM Math Fluency Morning Group	Assistance is provided to students with math skills development and math fact fluency practice using Sumdog and other resources as appropriate.
AM Reading Fluency Morning Group	Assistance is provided to students with sight word and reading fluency practice. Students are provided with positive reading experiences, increasing their motivation and interest in reading both inside and outside of school with a focus on developing readers.
English Language Learners After- School Program	DISTRICT-PROVIDED PROGRAM: This program is reserved only for students in the ELL program. Assistance is provided to students in practicing reading, writing, speaking and listening skills.

Activity	Description		
Basketball Group	Enrichment in the sport and the principles of sportsmanship are provided. Additionally, students are provided a platform to practice and enhance their basketball skills by playing organized games against fellow students. Due to the high level of students who wish to participate, students may be organized into cohorts. Students also participate in district competitions. Participation is contingent on the staff recommendation process outlined on the permission slip.		
Art Group	Students are provided with hands-on projects and a place to talk about what is happening in the art world. The facilitator encourages students to express their thoughts, feelings and creativity through various visual art forms. Members are involved in community service projects as well. (Ex: Making decorations for school activities, the annual school musical, etc.)		
Chess Group	Students participate in learning activities that encourage higher order thinking skills and positive socialization through the great game of chess in a fun and friendly forum. Through this activity, we seek to contribute significantly to the intellectual growth, self-esteem, sportsmanship, creativity, and social experience of our students.		
Student Leadership Team: Community Service Learning Projects Team	Students are provided with community service learning and volunteerism opportunities throughout the school year.

Students are expected to comply with the Code of Student Conduct and the 3 Bs. Students who do not comply or are not picked up on time will be excluded from the program.
- The Good News Club® is a ministry of Child Evangelism Fellowship in which trained organization teachers meet with groups of children in schools, homes, community centers, churches, apartment complexes, just about anywhere the children can easily and safely meet with their parent's permission. Students are expected to comply with the Code of Student Conduct and the 3 Bs. Students who do not comply or are not picked up on time will be excluded from the program.
