Pickett inherited his love of cars from both his grandfather who founded Pickett Automotive in Darby and from his father who took over the shop thirty years ago. The shop, responsible for repairing and maintaining domestic cars since the 1950s, also owns and races hotrods locally and regionally. Pickett's course reflects his belief that the world needs a mechanically savvy workforce now more than ever. Pickett explained, "The anatomy of a car engine is similar to that of a human, except when one of ours dies, we bring it back to life." #### Superintendent's Corner



The appointment of liaison representatives and committee co-chairs will also be posted to the website by January 2020 if there are any changes. I would like to thank the Upper Darby High School Encore Singers and the Concert Choir for their outstanding performance and for putting us in the holiday spirit. At this time, I would like to recognize District Chorus, Orchestra and Band for placement in the PMEA District 12 Chorus.

The following students placed in District Chorus: Sophomore - Kenneth Bruce Juniors - Dylan Ford, Rachel Hauben Seniors - Dan Eap (who also earned a placement as accompanist) Michael Naddeo, and Kaylen Snedeker Senior Mary Mollichella placed in District Band Molly Radford (a teacher) will be hosting District Orchestra at UDHS. I am happy to provide a brief update on the efforts to meet the goals of our current District Comprehensive Plan.

We have continued our work on Deep Equity Plan. The initial phase of the work on deep equity started with our District Administration, teaching staff, and parents. This year, our equity teams have continued with their training and turn-around training with each building, but we have also transferred this work to our students. We are also working on several other initiatives in the District such as: Restorative Practices, Trauma Informed Care, Positive Behavior and Supports (PBIS), new curriculum programs for math, science, and English and Language Arts, facilities improvements, improved security, and rebranding of our District. The collective efforts of this community and the staff here in this District have supported our very important work.

Over the last several months, we have continued to inform the public of our plans to improve our facilities. We have recently received good news with the approval of our height variance for the Aronimink Elementary School project. We will also hold the required Act 34 hearing as advertised on January 7th at Aronimink Elementary School at 7PM. We do have an alternate date of January 8th at Aronimink Elementary School at 7PM if there is inclement weather. The Act 34 hearing will allow for public comment on the proposed expansion and renovation of Aronimink Elementary School.

The Board will take action following a 30 day review of the received comments following the January 7th Act 34 hearing. We will also go before the Upper Darby Township Council in February for discussions and support on the Aronimink project. On December 10th, we will be meeting with the Clifton Heights Borough Planning Commission to discuss the proposed new middle school on the District-owned property in Clifton Heights. After months of back and forth over the plan to build the school, we are looking forward to meeting with the Borough. We will be live streaming the meeting, as we have been informed that only Clifton Heights residents will be able to comment.

The proposed new middle school in Clifton Heights has a positive impact on our entire school District, so we would like to keep everyone informed. We will provide more information of our live streaming of this event later this week. We have also recently announced our 2020 capital improvement plans. As we move forward with the Aronimink Project and proposed new middle school in Clifton Heights, we will continue to make \$5 million in facilities improvements to our current buildings.

### **Superintendent's Corner**

We will continue to communicate our progress on our facilities improvements as more information becomes available. During the November committee meetings, the Board and the public were provided an update on the financial health of the District.
