

SUPERINTENDENT'S CORNER



Our 2018-19 school calendar includes 183 instructional days. This means that for the 2018-19 school year, we are currently 4 instructional days short of the mandated instructional time required. Based on the instructional hours built into our regular student day, we are not at risk of falling below the instructional hours required by the state. While we have fallen short of the required 180 instructional days, Act 80 allows a school district to apply for an exception for professional development days, making them count towards the 180 instructional day requirement. We have enough of these potential exemption days to cover us for the 2018-19 school year. Therefore, at this time, we will not be adding any days to our district calendar. I would also like to inform the public that Mr. Grant and Mr. Craig Rogers will present an update to the Board and public regarding our 2018-19 Budget Process. At the April 23, 2019 Committee Meeting, a preliminary draft of the Proposed Final Budget will be presented. The Board will adopt the Proposed Final Budget at the May Board meeting. The budget presentation will also review staffing requests for the 2019-2020 School Year. A final adoption of the final budget will take place during a special voting meeting on June 18, 2019. I have been meeting with staff throughout the District since my appointment as Superintendent of Schools for this wonderful community. Thus far, I have met with the staff from Walter M. Senkow Elementary School and Primos Elementary School. I will continue to meet with staff throughout April and May. This evening, I am proud to continue to highlight the outstanding

Fair competition. Of our students. While not in attendance this evening, 28 students participated in the Delaware Countrate to index and Delaware Valley Science Fair competition. Of our 28 participants, 28 were selected to receive an award. We will be recognizing those students with a certificate from my office. The winners from this competition qualified to go on to the Delaware Valley Science Fair on Wednesday, April 3rd, with over 900 students from the tri-state area in attendance. We have so much talent in this District, and the talent begins with the support and guidance of our teachers and our parents and families. Our Upper Darby High School Staff, students, and administration are doing such great work, and we will be well represented at the awards ceremony by the following students led by Upper Darby High School teacher Roseann Burns.

Delaware County and Delaware Valley Science Fair Winners

Jenna Yocco - 2nd place in 9th grade Earth & Space Sciences for her project titled The Effect of Pulsar Age on Nulling Frequency.

Zach Finley - Honorable Mention in 9th grade Engineering for his project titled The Drag Coefficient.

Anna Fattizzo - 2nd place in 9th grade Behavioral Sciences for her project titled The Effect of Gender Stereotypes on Adjective Selection. Anna also won the Jack Mixit Award in Behavioral Sciences.

Nate Polidoro - Honorable Mention in 11th grade Mathematics for his project titled Investigation of Fibonacci Variations.

Lyla Nachimson - Honorable Mention in 11th grade Earth & Space Sciences for her project titled Climate Change on Mars. Lyla also won the American Meteorological Society Award.

Chris Dwyer - 3rd place in 11th grade Earth & Space Science for his project titled Determining the Redshift of Galaxies Photometrically. Chris also won a partial scholarship to The University of the Sciences.

Ms. Roseann Burns is also the teacher advisor for the Upper Darby High School Lunar/Planetary Club. On March 15th, the Upper Darby High School Lunar/ Planetary Club presented their original research titled The Transition from Simple to Complex Craters to the Delaware Valley Amateur Astronomers during their monthly meeting. The students have been conducting a two-year study to learn about the surfaces of Pluto and its moon, Charon. Using the Geospatial Information System, UD students were the first in the world to analyze the craters on Pluto and Charon to determine what is called *"The Transition Diameter", from simple to complex craters. Ms. Burns has informed me that, "...knowing this and the surface gravity; it can be determined whether the surface is either icy or rocky."* It is even more impressive that a year ago the students contacted two professional planetary geologists who encouraged them to seek publication for their amazing work! The students had to field questions from audience members, scientists, and science enthusiasts and performed beautifully. Here is another special note that makes this accomplishment so special. (Zach Thornton, Chris DeMott, Isabel Hunt, and Thomas Nguyen). The Lunar/Planetary Club will be presenting on April 10th to the Rittenhouse Astronomical Society at the Academy of Natural Sciences.

Congratulations to Upper Darby High School Senior, Reem Mohammed, who was awarded the 2019 Penn Medicine Teen Champion Award. Reem has been a volunteer with the Penn Medicine Organization and was nominated by her teachers and counselors.

When she showed up to volunteer at their Global Teen Health Week kickoff ceremony, she was surprised to learn that she was the teen champion and received the award. On March 2, 2019, Kyle Gordon, a 6th grader at DHMS, competed against 12 year old boys from all over the country in track for the 800 meter event. He finished 9th overall in the event with a time of 2:28 at the AAU Indoor Track and Field National. Championships in Landover, MD. Not to be outdone by her older brother is Kacy Gordon of Primos elementary School. She also competed in the 800 meter run against 7 and 8 year old girls from al over the country, finishing 2nd in her age group with a time of 3:06.
