What is PBIS?

PBIS is a framework that is made up of teaching school-wide behavior expectations to students, reinforcing those expectations and rewarding students when they meet them.

How does PBIS work?

PBIS is a three-tiered system of supports that involves frequent intervention to reward those who are successful and to provide additional support for those experiencing difficulty meeting expectations.
