First Grade


First graders learned how to use a ten frame in order to find the sum of addition equations to 10 with the use of manipulatives. Students really enjoyed using the counters!

In September, Highland Park reached the goal of earning 1,500 Golden Tickets. Students participated in a water balloon toss! It was a great way to celebrate reaching our goal.












Our goal for October is to earn 1,800 tickets. Our October incentive is a MOVIE DAY! Keep working hard everyone so we can reach our new goal.
