Be Respectful

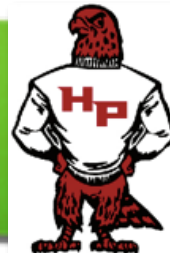
Be Responsible

- ★ Encourage your child to use appropriate language and tone.
- ★ Practice positive phrases with your child, such as, "Thank you," "Excuse me," "Please," and "I'm sorry."
- ★ Attend Highland Park meetings and other school activities as your schedule allows.

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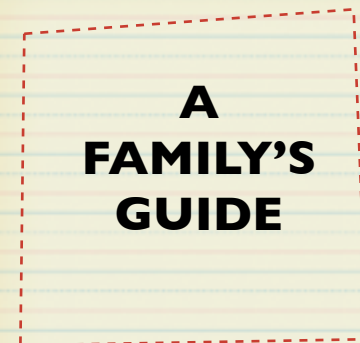

What is Positive Behavior Intervention & Support? (PBIS)

PBIS is a school-wide approach to discipline for creating a safer and more effective school. PBIS is a system approach to enhance the capacity of schools to educate all children by developing research-based, school wide, and classroom discipline systems. The process focuses on improving a school's ability to teach and support positive behavior for all students. With PBIS, instructional time is more effectively used for teaching and the overall school environment is calm and conducive to learning.

PBIS allows parents/guardians and teachers to have open communication about what is expected in all areas of the school. Our school's behavioral expectations center on the ideas of Safety, Responsibility, and Respect.

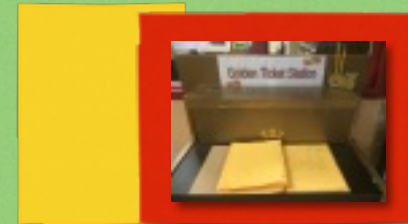


WHAT HAPPENS WHEN YOUR CHILD FOLLOWS THE 3 BEES

When students are safe, respectful, and responsible, everyone can be successful. Teachers are able to teach in an environment conducive to teaching and students are able to learn in an environment that is comfortable and safe.

GOLDEN TICKET

Individual award given to a student that behaves in a safe, respectful, or responsible manner



CLASSROOM GOLDEN TICKET

Classroom award given when a class is caught following the 3 Bees.
