ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS

UDHS Participates in Model Senate with World Affairs Council

Upper Darby students participated on Thursday, December 15, in the 2022 Model Senate on The Foreign Relations Committee, hosted by the World Affairs Council of Philadelphia and held at Temple University's Fox School of Business.

The program explored two topics of critical importance confronting the legislative branch of the United States. Students examined, from the perspective of U.S. Senators and Expert Witnesses, the investigation of the Russian invasion of Ukraine and assessed an appropriate U.S. response. The second topic touched on the ever growing presence of China in the Middle East, with students exploring legislative opportunities to protect U.S. interests in the region.

Students in the 2022 Model Senate program represented selected senators, committee co-chairs, expert witnesses, and journalists as they sought positive solutions to ongoing issues of national and international concern.

UDHS Participates in 10th Annual Ethics Bowl


Congratulations to the students involved in the 10th Annual Upper Darby High School Ethics Bowl. The students' dedication to preparing, writing, and researching was complemented by their high level of diplomacy, decorum, and polite discourse. The Annual Upper Darby High School Ethics Bowl has been a proud tradition here since 2012. Each year, the Parr Center for Ethics releases fifteen new cases, of which our Seminar students choose their favorites to apply various ethical theories learned in class. This year, students prepared a case about a pregnant woman's bodily autonomy, and another case that dealt with securing justice for the murder of Emmett Till– seventy years after the crime. Additionally, motivated student members of The Upper Darby Society of Ethics study all fifteen cases in preparation for the Regional High School Ethics Bowl held in February at Villanova University. Last year, Upper Darby made it into the semi finals, placing 4th out of 16 schools.



UDHS Participates in a National CyberPatriot Competition

This year, UDHS has three teams participating in the national CyberPatriot competition, sponsored by the U.S. Air Force. The competition puts students in the positions of newly highered IT professionals tasked with managing the network of a small company. Teams find and fix cybersecurity vulnerabilities while maintaining critical services.

This year all three teams scored high enough in preliminary rounds to place them in the Gold Tier in the State Round, held on Friday, December 9. We are currently awaiting the results of the State Round.
