Supplies

Course Description

Seventh grade ELA is the study of skills in reading, writing, speaking, and listening. The students in 7th grade will be using the Pearson Common Core Literature book. In this text, students will read a variety of fiction/non-fiction texts, poems, mythology/folk tales, and informational texts.

We will also read two novels throughout the year and students will be working on different types of writing such as narrative, persuasive, and expository.

<u>Daily warm ups</u> are in the category of classwork and will be graded spontaneously throughout the year.


